- 10.01 Purpose. This guideline will be implemented to assure a preplanned response to this particular target.
- 10.02 Goal. These guidelines will be used so that the Officer in Charge will know what the preplanned call up equipment will be.
- 10.03 Responding Units. Refer to box card 8-311-2 for response guidelines.
- 10.04 Due to the variety of products in the area, all personnel in the immediate vicinity of the fire will be in full turnout gear and will be wearing and using breathing apparatus unless otherwise designated by the Incident Commander or Safety Officer.
- 10.05 Wind direction, speed, humidity and weather conditions shall be constantly monitored during the entire incident.
- 10.06 A Type 3 Incident will be established as per Command Post S.O.G.
- 10.07 Radio Frequencies.
- A) Operations and Safety will use fire ground red.
 - B) Staging, tenders and fill site operations will use FG Blue frequency.
 - C) Air Operations will use Marc 2 frequency.
 - C) Emergicare and EMS will use Local Government.
 - D) Should a Second Fire be dispatched, the incident will be handled on the primary T.F.D. frequency if the incident is a single station response. If the incident requires more than a single station, there will be a need to switch to another available fire ground frequency.
- 10.08 All available breathing apparatus and bottles shall be taken to the staging area.
- 10.09 Additional help shall be provided for Dispatcher if at all possible.

- 10.10 The fill site for all tenders will be the pond in front of the complex unless otherwise directed, with a one way traffic pattern established.
- 10.11 Refer to map in Department vehicles for building and hydrant location.
- 10.12 Base shall call the Comm. Center and have them dispatch Emergicare and Eau Claire Ambulance to staging for standby. Also notify appropriate law enforcement agencies for traffic and crowd control.
- 10.13 All Battalion Chiefs shall report to Command Post for Division/Group Assignments. Other officers, when available to report to staging for assignment.
- 10.14 Fatigue --- If it appears that many hours will be spent at the scene, some personnel should be released, if possible, for the purpose of relief later in the fire. Personnel will be monitored by rehab and safety.
